Demographic Profile

The population in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC was 1,483 per American Community Survey data for 2014-2018.

The region has a civilian labor force of 673 with a participation rate of 56.9%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC, 32.8% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 32.9% in the nation.

The median household income in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC is \$36,601 and the median house value is \$144,300.



Employment Trends


As of 2019Q4, total employment for the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC was 1,696 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2019Q4, employment declined 0.6% in the region.

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC earned annual wages of \$37,837 as of 2019Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 3.2% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$57,413 in the nation as of 2019Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 12.8% lower in Town of Pilot Mountain, NC than the U.S. average.





Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC is Construction, employing 279 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Health Care and Social Assistance (244 workers) and Educational Services (226). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Construction (LQ = 2.87), Educational Services (1.64), and Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (1.41).

Sectors in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$76,573), Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$69,152), and Finance and Insurance (\$52,327). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Construction (+111 jobs), Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (+33), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (+12).

Over the next 1 year, employment in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC is projected to expand by 1 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +2.7% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+7 jobs), Construction (+1), and Accommodation and Food Services (+1).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 206 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (192 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (181). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (LQ = 2.48), Education, Training, and Library Occupations (1.82), and Personal Care and Service Occupations (1.62).

Occupation groups in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$97,200), Legal Occupations (\$81,700), and Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$68,700). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.8% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 6.7% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.8% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Personal Care and Service Occupations (+3 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+2). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (35 jobs) and Construction and Extraction Occupations (20).



Industry Clusters


A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC with the highest relative concentration is Textile/Leather with a location quotient of 4.61. This cluster employs 12 workers in the region with an average wage of \$34,138. Employment in the Textile/Leather cluster is projected to contract in the region about 3.9% per year over the next ten years.



Education Levels


Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Town of Pilot Mountain, NC is projected to grow 0.1% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.3% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 0.3% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.5% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 820 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 23 major groups, 96 minor groups, and 449 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
